COMMANDING OFFICER'S POLICY STATEMENT ON ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Lemoore is committed to environmental stewardship and the responsibility to preserve and protect natural resources and the environment through an Environmental Management System (EMS). We are committed to compliance with federal, state, and local environmental laws and regulations and:

- a. Compliance with Executive Order 13514-Federal Leadership in Environmental, Energy, and Economic Performance.
- b. Compliance with Navy environmental and energy policies and directives listed in OPNAV M-5090.1E, Environmental Readiness Program Manual and OPNAVINST 5090.1D, Environmental Readiness Program.
- c. Integrating sound environmental practices into all business decisions and standard operating procedures in support of environmental sustainability.
- d. Reducing our organization's environmental impact through education, identification and implementing of pollution prevention opportunities, and conservation of our resources.
- e. Utilizing process improvement, policy changes, and technology whenever feasible, to decrease hazardous waste generated by our facility.
- f. Educating our employees, contractors and vendors about their responsibilities to the environment, as well as assigning accountability and developing preventive action for non-compliance.
- g. Continuously improving environmental performance through Defense Health Agency (DHA) and Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED) external audits, annual Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Lemoore internal audits, and management reviews, to evaluate our progress towards our environmental goals.
- h. Fostering communication and collaboration throughout the organization, in addition to community and installation leaders, regarding environmental goals and performance.
